County of Jasper being weak in body but sound mind and memory blessed by
Almighty God for the same but knowing it is appointed for all mortal men
once to die do make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner
and form following (that) is to say.

1st I give to my son Josiah Banks all that tract of land whereon I now
live together with, with all the land owned by me adjoining the same three
hundred and thirty two acres more or less.

It 2nd My will and desire is that all my children hereinafter named be equal
partakers in all my Estate not above disposed of viz^t Edmund Banks, Baton
Banks, ^{Sarah P. Spear} Sarah P. Spear, Ann Emory, Elizabeth Buckhammon, Caroline Boyde,
Mary Thornton and Josiah C. Banks if the aforesaid children should not
agree in a division of my property herein named my will and desire is that all
my property not disposed as aforesaid be sold by my Executors hereinafter named
and the proceeds equally divided between my children above named so as to make
each one's part equal in Estate Negroes names. Ruben, Alice, Dennis, Easter
Judy, Clark, Franky, Mary, Selina, Sarah, and Mahaly together with all
my stock of Horses, Cattle, Hogs & Sheep with all my household and kitchen
furniture & farming utensils of all kinds all be disposed as aforesaid by my Exrs.

It 3rd I give to my son John Banks dec^d children Emily A. Banks and John
Henry Banks two hundred dollars each to be paid out of monies due me or
that I may leave at my decease. I hereby appoint Baton Banks and Josiah
C. Banks my sole Executors of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking
all former Wills by me made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
seal this twenty first day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred and twenty nine. Signed, sealed, published and declared by
the above named John Banks to be his last Will in the presence of us who have
hereunto subscribed our names as Witnesses in the presence of the Testator
