state of health; but perfect in mind and memory; thanks
be given to God for the same: and calling to mind the
uncertainty of my body, and knowing that it is appointed
once for all to die - I do make and ordain this my last
will and testament - First and principally of all I recom-
mend my soul in the hands of God - that gave it. And as
touching such worldly estate wherewith God hath blessed
me in this life, I give and bequeath in the manner
and form as follows to wit to wit first after all my debts
is paid, I give and bequeath all that I have to my
wife Elvira Lunsford - Likewise I constitute & appoint
Elijah Rivers and Luke Williams to be my Executors to
this my last will and testament, ratifying and confirming
this to be my last will and testament, and do utterly
disallow and revoke all other wills heretofore made by me

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and no other. In witness whereof I have set my hand and
affixed my seal this 6th of June 1823.
