

Georgia. In the name of God Amen I Jesse Walker of
 Jasper County in the State and County aforesaid being conscious of my
 approaching dissolution knowing that it is appointed once for all men to die
 but being in proper senses and memory do make ordain and constitute this
 my last will and testament. First of all I recommend my soul to God
 who gave it and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a
 Christian like manner nothing doubting but that I shall receive the same
 again at the Great day of the Resurrection by the mighty power of him who
 gave it and as touching my worldly effects I give and bequeath in the
 following manner viz; 1st I give to Rachel Hawnock five Dollars
 2nd I give to John Walker five Dollars 3rd I give to William Walker five
 Dollars 4th I give to Nancy Greene five Dollars 5th I will that after
 paying my just Debts that thirty Dollars be paid towards building a shelter
 at Rock Spring Camp. Ground 6th I will that all my landed property
 be sold and the proceeds thereof to be appropriated, as follows viz; Fifty
 Dollars to the Publishing fund of the Methodist Episcopal Church in New
 York and forty Dollars to Indigent worn out superannuated Preachers of
 the Methodist E Church in the State of Georgia and I further will
 bequeath to the widows and children of worn out Preachers as aforesaid the
 sum of one hundred Dollars 7th I bequeath to Yellow River and Cedar Creek
 Circuits fifty Dollars each a year to make up the deficiency of the Preachers allow-
 ances so far as the proceeds of the sales of my land may go. I further will
 that my stock of Hogs sheep 100 cart and oxen household and kitchen furni-
 ture plantation tools, corn and fodder and Horses be sold and the proceeds of said
 sale be given to make up the allowance of the Preachers in Yellow River & Cedar
 Creek & McCoy circuits of the Methodist E Church twenty Dollars a year each
 so far as the proceeds of said sales may go. And I further will that my neg-
 girl Luitilda at my death be given to Thomas Wildon provided said Wildon will
 pay the sum of four hundred Dollars for her in three equal annual instalments
 and appropriate the money in the following manner viz; one hundred and thirty
 three 33 1/3 Dollars the first year that Wildon has possession of said neg-
 the money to be laid out for Hymn Books for the use of poor methodist people
 that is not able to buy them. The 2nd year he will pay the same amount for
 Watson's Theological Institute for the use as aforesaid. The third year he

shall pay the same amount for the life of Wesley and the same sum for the purposes aforesaid all to be appropriated within the limits of Georgia Appoint Moses Weldon my executor to execute this my last will & testament. 10th October 1832. Signed sealed and pronounced in presence of
