George W. Thomas Deed of the County State of  
Ohio, last 13<sup>th</sup> being of record, under (number), last bearing  
the certainty of death & the uncertainty of the time there  
is, some made and related the following to being a  
will & testament.

Item 1<sup>st</sup> - I give and bequeath to my son  
William, & Peter, lots of land, number one hundred and  
fifty four, number one hundred and fifty five, and number  
one hundred and seventy six, containing each two hundred  
two and a half acres, in the northern District of Virginia,  
Washington, who before County in said State, and the half  
of lot number the hundred and seventy seven, in the same  
District and County aforesaid, containing one hundred one  
and a quarter acres - three strong Negro, twenty two years  
of age - two twenty years, and twenty aged sixteen  
years and her mother, and also the one eighth part of the  
balance of my slaves (including the value of the  
above named slaves) to be deducted from his share of  
my share. The above named slaves are now in the hands  
of a slave give to him the fifth part of the net of my personal  
property, which will be more fully explained in one of  
the other slaves of the my last will and testament.

Item 2<sup>nd</sup> - I give and bequeath to my son William  
& Peter his mother and her mother, in trust for the  
use of my daughter Nancy Smith & her children when  
they arrive at the age of twenty one (but if none of her  
children should arrive to the age of maturity, then the  
said trust must divide the following monies property  
among my then surviving children) William, a share equal  
twenty three, Lucy aged twenty three years, one half  
Maria, and Nancy a woman and her children  
Puffin, Caroline and Priscilla and their issue, equal  
with trust to my son William, & Peter, & the use of  
the children of my daughter Nancy Smith for  
four hundred dollars, to be paid when they arrive at  
the age of twenty one, without interest, and over
