 and good state of health and knowing that it is ordained for all men to die
 and being sensible of the immortality of the soul do make ordain and con-
 stitute this my last will and testament. Item 1st I give and bequeath my negro
 woman Positter and her two male children to my niece Jane Whitfield
 formerly Robey. I also give her Meziab Positters oldest child till she arrives
 to the age of Eighteen years of age then to let her go free & be her guardian
 or petition the Legislature for her freedom. I hope she will take good care
 of Meziab to learn her how get her living. I wish Harry and Sally his
 wife and her child Charles to be sent to Maryland and given to my two
 sisters Mary Ann & Catharin and to their lawful heirs forever. Item 2^d
 If Frederick wishes to go to Maryland let him be given to my two sisters
 above named. If Frederick is not willing to go to Maryland let him be sold
 the money equally divided between my nephew Isaiah Robey and my
 nephew James Robey of Maryland and my other nephew Matthew Robey
 of this State and his oldest sister Ann of the Alabama State.
 I also give and bequeath my negro boy Joe to my hereafter named
 Executor Mrs. Robey (Jan^y I wish my) negro woman Rose and
 her children Lucy and Eliza sold, also my lands wherever I now live
 and a lot in Dick County also my stock of all kinds house
 hold and Kitchen furniture and after my just debts is paid to give
 my sister in law Elizabeth Hickentotten one hundred Dollars to
 buy all the above named negroes a suit of mourning apparel and after taking

money to defray the expense of sending the above named negroes to sell
and the remainder to be equally divided between the following persons
Isaac, Roby and James Roby my nephews of Marylande Anne
Roby my niece of Alabama State Presy. Roby Gauster of S.
C. deceased Mathew Roby and Wm Son Roby Anne and Robert
Roby my nephews I also hope there will be no contention.

I also do nominate and appoint John E Glover & Wm Son ^{Roby} my law
ful executors to this my last will and testament Given under my hand
and seal this 3 March 1826.
