

Ordinary Office Jasper County 1894

I Jordan Compton of the State of Georgia
Jasper County, aforesaid, being of a sound mind & memory
knowing that all men must die, do make this my last
will and testament, my soul I give up to my maker
who gave me all things, my body I desire to be
speedily buried as my friends direct.

First - To my wife Elizabeth Compton in regard to the
love and affection I have for her, I will and bequeath
one negro man named Miles, one negro woman
named Nancy and her child Perry, and a negro
Lewis, one shod horse called Dragon and a yoke
of Oxen & cart 20 1/2 acres of land whereon I now
live - Second I will and bequeath the rest of
my property, the household furniture except to be
sold as the law directs & my just debts paid
to my son John to whom I have
given a horse of the value of one hundred & twenty dollars
to be deducted from his part.

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Book 4 (1822-1823)
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I appoint my son John & my wife Elizabeth my
executors - In testimony whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and affixed my seal this 16th December
1892

Will, who being duly sworn say that they saw
Plazant Compton sign, seal, publish & declare the same
to be his last will & testament & that at said time he was
of sound disposing mind and memory & that D. A. Reese

who gave me all things, my soul I give up to my maker
 speedily buried as my Grand child.
 First - To my wife Elizabeth Compton in regard to the
 love and affection I have for her, I will and bequeath
 one negro man named Miles, one negro woman
 named Fanny and her child Piny, and a negro
 Lewis, one shawl horse called Dragon and a yoke
 of Oxen & cart 202 1/2 acres of land whereon I now
 live - Second I will and bequeath the rest of
 my property, the household furniture excepted to be
 sold as the law directs & my Just debts paid &
 the balance to be divided equally among my
 children except my son John to whom I have
 given a horse, the value of one hundred & twenty dollars
 to be deducted from his part. -
 I appoint my son John & my wife Elizabeth, my
 executors - In testimony whereof I have hereunto
 signed my hand and affixed my seal this 16th December
