I, Thomas Tucker, considering the uncertainty of this mortal life & being of sound mind and memory do make and publish this my last will and testament in the manner and form following Viz- I give and bequeath to my son Puntum, one feather bed & furniture, one cow and calf and one sow and pigs to be delivered when he calls for them & I give and bequeath unto my daughter Roddy a certain proven account on the estate of James Collier son. due for two hundred dollars - It is further my will and testament that all the rest, residue and remainders of all my estate and effects, real and personal, whatsoever and wheresoever not herein before otherwise disposed of, should be kept together by

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my dear and beloved wife Elizabeth until her death after her death to be equally divided amongst my children, viz. Margaret, William, Jeremiah, Sarah, Mary, Puntum, John, Roddy & my grandson John Thomas Dingle; but if my said grandson John should die before he becomes of age, then his part to return to my other children; and it is further my will that my dear sons William and John should be executors of this my last will & testament
