name of Martha. Also I give and bequeath unto
Mrs Ann Shepherd one hundred dollars in money
Also I give and bequeath to Sarah Saunders two
hundred dollars in money to a negro boy by the name of Prince

Also I give and bequeath to Riley Wise one bay mare
saddle — Also I give and bequeath to my sisters Dorcas
Freeman's and Elizabeth Wyse's children the balance of
my negroes one girl by the name of Kelly, one by
the name of Fleming, and one by the name of Jasher
and one by the name of Lucket, and one by the
name of Nelson, and one by the name of Daniel
and the balance of my money and it is to be equally
divided amongst them these children.

I likewise constitute make and ordain my loving
wife Ruthy Johnson the sole executrix of this my
last Will and testament, and I so hereby utterly
