Jasper County, Mitchell of the county & state aforesaid, being
at this time, praised be God, of perfect mind & memory,
do make and constitute this to be my last will and
testament in the manner and form following, Viz.
First I recommend my soul to God, the author of all being.
Second my Body to be interred in a decent and Christian
like manner to the earth from whence it came. —
Thirdly and lastly, as to my worldly effects, I bequeath
them in the manner and form following (I.e.) I gratuitously
give and bequeath to my half Brother Richard Mitchell
my tract or parcel of land, in the County of Henry, it being
the one half of a whole now in the account of said
County, to Thomas Cuel, of the above named County,
the balance of my estate both real and personal I
give unto my only son Walter Mitchell, after
my just debts and burial and funeral expences are paid
for him and his companion to him and inherit in several
possessions for and during their natural lives, so that
neither Walter nor his wife Elizabeth shall convey any
part of said property to any person or persons whatsoever
except the offsprings of the said Walter and Elizabeth, and
after their decease to be equally divided among their off-
springs as above stated, except their eldest son William S.
Mitchell to him and inherit a horse, saddle & bridle
and my wearing watch more than the rest. —
And I also appoint Walter Mitchell & Gustavus Keaton
whole and sole executors of this my last will & testament.
In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal
this 3rd day of October 1833.

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Testament in the manner and form following, Viz.
First I recommend my soul to God, the author of all being.
Second my Body to be interred in a decent and Christian

Thirdly and lastly, as to my worldly effects, I bequeath
them in the manner and form following (I.e.) I gratefully
give and bequeath to my half Brother Richard Stutchell
my tract or parcel of land, in the County of Henry, it being
the one half of No thirty nine in the eleventh district of said
County, granted to Thomas Covel, of the above named County,
the balance of my estate both real and personal I
give unto my only son Walter Stutchell, after
my just debts and burial and funeral expences are paid
for him and his companion to him and inherit in several
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And after my wife Elizabeth shall convey any
part of said property to any person or persons whatsoever
except the offsprings of the said Walter and Elizabeth, and
after their decease to be equally divided among their off-
springs as above stated, except their eldest son William B.
Stutchell to him and inherit a horse, saddle & bridle
and my wearing watch more than the rest.

And I also appoint Walter Stutchell & Aristarchus Fenton
whole and sole executors of this my last will & testament.
