

Georgia, Jasper County & Knowing that man is mortal,
and must needs die & being of sound & disposing
mind, do make and publish this my last Will and
Testament - in manner & form following, viz -

1st After all my just debts are paid, I dispose of all
my worldly property of which I am possessed as
follows - It is my will and desire that after my
death, all my property be kept together, the negroes, &c
worked on my plantations as they now are, and all
the property made and accumulated; after defraying
all the current expenses of my family, shall become
a part of my estate, & to be disposed of as hereinafter
mentioned -

2. I bequeath to my son William Penn five thousand
dollars at any time he may require it after he arrives
to the age of twenty one years -

3. I bequeath to my son Stephen A. Penn five thousand
dollars, at any time he may require it, after he arrives
to the age of twenty one years -

4th I bequeath to my daughter Martha Penn five thou-
sand dollars at any time she may require it, after
she marries or arrives to the age of twenty one years -

5th I bequeath to my daughter Mary Penn five thousand
dollars, at any time she may require it, after she arrives
to the age of twenty one years or marries -

6th I bequeath to my son Joseph Penn five thousand
dollars, when he arrives to the age of twenty one years -

7th I bequeath to my sister Levia Elizabeth Penn five
thousand dollars, to be paid to her when my youngest
child arrives to the age of twenty one years; but if
she marries before that time, she is then to receive
this legacy -

8th It is my will and desire that all my children
supported & receive good English education out of my
estate, untill they marry, or arrives to the age of twenty one
years - & then each one who does not draw his or her

Legacy from my estate, to be clothed and supported out of
said estate, untill he or she shall actually receive the
legacy left by this will -

9th Whenever a legacy is to be paid out under this will
& there shall not be money enough belonging to the
estate on hand, then such property as my executors
may think best for the interest of the estate shall
be sold, to make up the amount of money needed -

10th After all the foregoing legacies and expenses are
paid, it is my will that all the residue of my
estate be sold & the money arising from sale,
to be equally divided amongst my children and
my wife, so that each shall have individually
an equal share -

11th Should death or loss of property so reduce my
estate, as not to leave five thousand dollars each
for my youngest children & my wife, then it is
my will, ^{that my children} what may have received their legacies
under this will, be bound to make up an equal
sum of money for my youngest children & wife
so that equal justice may be done to each individ-
ually in the distribution of my estate & those receiving
legacies to be bound in writing at the time receiving
the legacy to abide the true spirit & meaning of
this clause in my will -

12th I hereby constitute and appoint my son William Penn
my executor when he arrives to the age of twenty one years,
and also my son Stephen A. Penn when he arrives to
the age of twenty one years, is also appointed an execu-
tor to this will - Should I die before my son William
Penn is twenty one years of age, then it is my will
and request that the Justices of the Inferior Court
of said State & County see to the faithful execution
of this my will, untill my son William Penn
is twenty one years of age & is qualified as executor -
In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand
