said minor children by their Grandfather Wm. W. W. we
proceeded this day to the performance of that duty there
were three distributives as above named the shares were
numbered 1. 2. 3. and were assigned to the distributives in
the following manner to wit: The names of the distributives
were written on a piece of paper and placed in a hat.
The numbers were written on another piece of paper and
put in another hat. The hats were both well shaken
a name was then drawn from the hat containing the
names then a number was drawn from the hat containing
the numbers and in that manner continued till all were
drawn. The following is the result.
