

Jones and Thomas H. Wells which is as near equal as we could well arrange them. Henry P. Jones is to pay Thomas H. Wells one hundred & seventy five dollars to equalize them

Georgia 3 In pursuance of an order to us directed Jefferson County, emanating from the Honorable the Justices of the Inferior Court of said County sitting as a Court of Admiralty in carrying out the provisions of the last Will and Testament of James H. Carwell deceased, we have this day proceeded in the discharge of our duty to appraise and arrange the negroes in lots of as near equal value as possible in order to arrive at one equal share for John W. Denney one of the Heirs of said Estate, agreeable to said last Will of said deceased and have arranged them in the following manner
