said deceased, William G. Lyond. The minor heirs of John
G. Lyond deceased to wit. David Lyond, Margaret Lyond
and Jordan R. Lyond, we proceeded in the following manner
This day to execute said order after first having duly appraised
the distributees were found no five and of course the
estate was to be divided as near as possible into three
equal shares or parts. We thereby arranged the slaves, class
listing them as far as possible by families & divided them into
five equal lots, which were designated as follows Lot No 1
Lot No 2 Lot No 3 Lot No 4 Lot No 5:

The difference in the value of the several lots was
found to be as follows. Number 1 was worth twenty two
hundred dollars & hence eighty dollars less than an average
Lot No 1, was worth twenty four hundred & fifty dollars &
& hence one hundred & seventy dollars over an average. No 2
was worth twenty one hundred dollars & hence eighty dollars

under an average. No 3 was worth \$ 22. 50 & hence sold over
 average. No 3 was worth \$ 2. 50 & hence sold under average at
 distribution being worth twenty two hundred & eighty dollars
 having settled the ~~total~~^{total} value & mode of equalizing the same after
 was to assign to the distributor their lots in a fair manner. To accomplish
 this we wrote down on five pieces of paper the names of the distributor
 and on five other pieces of paper the different numbers of the lots
 No 1. No 2. No 3. No 4. No 5. These five pieces of paper were
 thrown just into two lots. The pieces with names of distributor in one
 lot the pieces with names of distributor in another lot & both lots
 were then well shaken, & distributed persons were then selected
 by the commissioners to draw from both lots. The drawing was as follows
 a lot was drawn from one hat then a name from another, a lot
 was drawn from one hat then a name from another until the
 several pieces of paper were all drawn. The lots as they were drawn
 were determined should go to the person whose name was drawn
 from the hat under these arrangements.
