Georgia. By virtue of an order from the Jefferson County, Honorable Court of Ordinary of said County to us directed, bearing date December twenty ninth one thousand Eight hundred & fifty five authorising and requiring us to make distribution of the Estate of the late James Matthews deceased among the Legatees under the last Will & Testament of said deceased, being the residue of negroes after those entitled & bequeathed were taken off & delivered to this day proceeded to the Performance of that duty. We ascertained there were two Heirs or Legatees to divide the residue of said negroes between viz Lewis D. Matthews Trustee for Mary the W. Cheatham and her children and Charles Matthews Trustee for Lydia Elizabeth Matthews, and twenty six negroes were apportioned at the sum or price of Seventeen thousand and two hundred & fifty dollars, each Legatee represented by their Trustee entitled to eight thousand six hundred & twenty five Dollars. The shares were numbered one & two and were assigned to the Legatees through their Trustees in the following manner to wit; the names of the Trustee representing each Legatee & the Legatee he represented were written on a piece of paper & placed in a hat, the numbers were written on another piece of paper and put in another hat, the hats were both well shaken, a name was then drawn from the hat containing the names, then a number from the hat containing the numbers, the following is the result.

Number one was drawn by Lewis D. Matthews Trustee for Mrs. Martha W. Cheatham & her children and consisted of thirteen negroes (viz Mary & her 12 Children born, Amy, Maria, Amijay, Elbert & Clemens, George, Harry, Jack, Abram, Phil and Pete valued at eight thousand six hundred and fifty dollars and is to receive Seventy five dollars from but Number ten to make them equal.

Number two was drawn by Charles Matthews, Trustee for
 Julia Elizabeth Matthews and consisted of Thirteen
 negroes viz Willy & her three children Ned, Ned & Green,
 Ruth & her two children Betty and Albert, William Wash
 Bob, Charles, Henry Edward and Billy valued at eight
 thousand Seven hundred dollars and pays lot Number
 One Seventy Five Dollars to make the two lots of equal
 value. all done after the Commissioners were duly sworn
 & respectfully submitted to the Honorable County Ordinary
 of said County in obedience to its requirements. This the
