James Stapleton Commissioners appointed to divide the Estate of Moses Thompson deceased were duly sworn to the performance of that duty. Given under my hand and official Seal this Dec. 27th 1855.

Georgia. By virtue of an order from the Jefferson County, Honorable Court of Ordinary of said County to us directed, bearing date December twenty fourth one thousand Eight hundred & fifty five authorizing and requiring us to make distribution of the Estate of the late James Matthews deceased among the Legatees under the last Will & Testament of said deceased, being the residue of negroes after those willed & bequeathed were taken off & delivered we this day proceeded to the performance of that duty. We ascertained there were two Heirs or Legatees to divide the residue of said Negroes between viz Lewis D. Matthews Trustee for Martha M. Cheatham and her children and Charles Matthews Trustee for Julia Elizabeth Matthews and jointly six Negroes were appraised at the sum or price of Seventy thousand and two hundred & fifty dollars, each Legatee represented by their Trustee entitled to Eight thousand Six hundred & twenty five Dollars. The shares were numbered one & two and were assigned to the Legatees through their Trustees in the following manner to wit: the names of the Trustee representing each Legatee & the Legatee he represented were written on a piece of paper & placed in a hat; the numbers were written on another piece of paper and put in another hat; the hats were both well shaken, a name was then drawn from the hat containing the names, then a number from the hat containing the numbers, the following is the result:

Number one was drawn by Lewis D. Matthews Trustee for Mrs. Martha M. Cheatham & her children and consisted of thirteen Negroes viz Mary & her six children Tom, Pegg, Hannah, Amey, Elbert & Coleman, George, Shanny, Jack, Abram, Phil and Kate valued at Eight thousand five hundred and fifty dollars and is to receive seventy five dollars from but Number two to make them equal.

number two was drawn by Charles Matthews Trust for
 Julia Elizabeth Matthews and consisted of fifteen
 negroes viz. Betty & her three children Fred, Red & Green
 Ruth & her two children Betty and Albert, Yellow back
 Bob, Charles, Henry Edward and Billy valued at Eight
 thousand seven hundred dollars and pays but number
 one seventy five dollars to make the two lots of equal
 value. all done after the commissions were duly sworn
 & respectfully submitted to the Honorable Court of Ordinary
 of said County in obedience to its requirements. This the
 fourth day of January in the Year of our Lord one thou-
 sand Eight hundred & fifty six.
