State of Georgia { By virtue of an order of the Court
Jefferson County } of ordinary of said county to me
directed to make a distribution of the estate of Rebecca
Cain a minor late of said county deceased the same
being slaves in the hand of Edward H. H. Hause
the guardian of said deceased among her lawful
distributaries Margaret G Cain Jane Cain (wife of
James S Cain) Hamilton & Margaret Cain.

We proceeded in the following manner this day to
execute said order after first being duly sworn
according to law. The distribution of said estate was
found to be four & of course the estate was to
be divided as near as possible into four equal
parts. We then arranged the slaves classifying
them as far as possible into four equal
parts or lots which were designated as follows

 in the value of the several lots was found to be
 as follows. Lot No 1 was found to worth One hundred
 & thirty-seven 5- $\frac{1}{2}$ /100 dollars less than a distribution
 share - an average distribution share being worth
 Twenty-eight hundred & thirty seven 5- $\frac{1}{2}$ /100 dollars.
 No 2. Was found to be worth twelve 5- $\frac{1}{2}$ /100 dollars
 more than a distribution share - No 3 was found
 to be worth One hundred & thirty seven 5- $\frac{1}{2}$ /100 dollars
 less than a distribution share & No 4 was found to be
 worth One hundred & sixty 5- $\frac{1}{2}$ /100 dollars more than
 a distribution share. The next wrote down on four
 separate pieces of paper the names of the distributees and
 on four other pieces of paper the name of the negroes
 in the different lots numbering them lots No 1 Lot 2.
 Lot No 3 & Lot No 4. These eight pieces of paper were
 put into two hats the pieces with the names of the
 distributees in one hat the pieces with the lots of the
 slaves in the other hat and both hats were then
 well shaken. One of the afferians then drew one of
 the names of the distributee from one hat & then the
 names of a lot of slaves from the other hat until
 the several pieces were all drawn - under this arrange-
 ment Lot No 1
