By virtue of an order from the Honorable Superior Court of said County when sitting for ordinary purposes on the second Monday in January last past, to us directed, authorizing and requiring us to make distribution of the Estate of the late Samuel Penny deceased, among the distributees entitled to said Estate, we proceeded this day to the performance of that duty.
