Georgia. By virtue of an order from
Jefferson County the Honorable Court of ordinary
of said County, bearing date the third day of March
Eighteen Hundred & Fifty Seven, to us directed, authori-
zing and requiring us to make distribution of the
Estate of the late Walter Darley deceased among
the Distributees of said Estate, we proceeded on this
day to the performance of that duty. We ascertained
there were two distributees to-wit: Mrs Jane Pollard
Darley widow and relict of said Walter Darley deceased,
and Mary Agnes Darley minor heir of said deceased rep-
resented in the division by her mother and Guardian the
said Jane P. Darley. The negroes were divided into two
lots Lot Number One consisting of Holland valued at
Eleven hundred & fifty dollars and Lucy valued at two hun-
dred & fifty dollars making in the aggregate the sum of
Thirteen hundred dollars and assigned to Mary Agnes
Darley, represented by her Guardian as aforesaid and the
balance the sum of Seventy five dollars from lot number
Two Lot Number Two consisting of Phillis valued at
Five hundred dollars, Martha valued at Nine hundred dollars
and Robert valued at One hundred & fifty dollars, making
in the aggregate the sum of Fifteen hundred & fifty dollars
was assigned to Mrs Jane P. Darley, and she to pay to
herself as Guardian the sum of Seventy five dollars to
make the two lots of equal value, the sum of Thirteen
hundred & seventy five dollars being a distribution share
all which is most respectfully submitted, given this
14th day of March 1857.

Bibb County. From the Honorable the ordinary
of Jefferson County sitting for Ordinary purposes on the
14th day of November 1856 to us directed, authorizing
us to make a distribution of the Estate of Luke Mc-
Glohorn late of Jefferson County deceased among the
distributors of said Estate as provided to us by Asa
Scott Guardian of Mary Grier formerly Mary McGlo-
horn and Sandy McGlohorn heirs and distributors of
Luke McGlohorn decd. We have this day proceeded to
the performance of said duty and find two distribu-
tees to wit Mary Grier wife of John M. Grier and
formerly Mary McGlohorn and Sandy McGlohorn a mi-
nor whose interest was represented by Asa Scott Guar-
dian of said Minor. The property consisted of the fol-
lowing Negroes viz Ellen a woman, Nancy a Girl, Maniah
a Girl, Phil a boy and Alfred a boy. The slaves were
numbered 1 and 2 and were assigned to the distributors
in the following manner to wit:

Lot No. 1. Consisting of
Ellen a woman valued at \$550.00
Nancy a Girl valued at 600.00
and Phil a boy valued at 800.00
making a total value of \$1950.00
all of which is awarded to John M. Grier Fur-
ther for the sole use benefit and behoof of his wife
Mary Grier.
Lot No. 2. Consisting of
Alfred a boy valued at \$1000.00
and Maniah a Girl valued at 950.00
making a total value of \$1950.00
which still re-
mains in the hands of Asa Scott Guardian of
