

Georgia. By virtue of an order from
Jefferson County, the Honorable Court of Ordinary,
of said County, dated the Fifth day of December in the
year of our Lord Eighteen Hundred & Fifty nine to us
directed authorizing and requiring us to make distribu-
tion of the Negroes of the Estate of the late William
D. Jordan deceased among the distributees of said Estate
we proceeded on the day to the performance of that duty. We
ascertained there were Eight distributees to wit: Rhoda
Jordan Widow & relict of said William D. Jordan deceased
John G. Jordan, William R. Miller, in right of his wife
Emily Miller formerly Emily Jordan daughter of said Wil-
liam D. Jordan deceased, Robert Jordan, Susannah L. Jor-
dan, Augustus W. Mumfrees in right of his wife Charlotte
D. Mumfrees formerly Jordan daughter of said William D.
Jordan deceased, Lursey Jordan and Mary D. Jordan
the last two being minors represented by John G. Jordan
their Guardian. The Widow Rhoda Jordan selected her
lot Consisting of Rachel, George, Lavinia and Ben valued
at Fifty six hundred dollars. The remaining Negroes were
divided into seven lots, numbered from one to seven and
were assigned to the distributees in the following manner
to wit: the names of the distributees, were written on
pieces of paper and placed in a hat, the numbers were writ-
ten on other pieces of paper & put in another hat, they
were both well shaken; a name was then drawn from
the hat containing names then a number was drawn
from the hat containing the numbers, the following is the
result -

erty is four thousand four hundred and thirty seven dollars,
fifty cents, those not receiving that amount to be made
equal from the other property of the Estate to draw interest
from the date until paid.

to the three heirs entitled to a share in said Estate proceeded
this day to perform that duty we divided the said Negroes
into three lots.

Lot No. 1, valued 2950.00 was drawn by James
C. Hudson Guardian for Emma C. Farmer.

Lot No. 2, valued at \$2900.00 was drawn by James
C. Hudson Guardian for Edward W. H. Farmer.

Lot No. 3, valued at 2500.00 was drawn by James
Hannah and wife Elizabeth.

Lot No. 4, embraced \$1000.00 from 500.00
Louisa 500.00 Martha 600.00 Total \$2900.00
