named are to give to the Exors of L. B. Postick receipts in
full for all demands which they may have against said
Estate.

Georgia, Jefferson County. By virtue of an order from the Honorable the Court of Ordaining of said County in the Seventh day of April last made to us directed authorizing and requiring us to make distribution of the Negroes belonging to the Estate of William Parker deceased among the Legatees, under said Will we proceeded this day to the performance of that duty. There were Ten Legatees named in said Will to wit Nancy Parker, widow and relict of said William Parker deceased. The heirs or children of James A. Parker deceased represented by Henry C. Watter's Exors of the deceased last aforesaid. The children of Mrs. Sarah Jordan represented by Sterling G. Jordan their father. Joseph T. Parker. Aquila W. Parker. Thomas D. Parker. Elizabeth D. Mosely wife of Thomas Mosely. Martha A. ~~Wife of Philip J. Evans~~ and Mary C. S. Stevens wife of Edmund N. Stevens each represented by Joseph T. Parker. trustee under & by virtue of the Will of said William Parker deceased. And Francis L. Parker. We were informed that the said Nancy Parker widow and relict aforesaid, would have her interest paid off in money

in the distribution of property, but that the property was to be distributed between the surviving heirs. The share was therefore numbered from one to nine inclusive, and was then assigned to the said children. The dog also under said will, as before, it was: Of the same age & color, nine in number that each number upon it a name of said children. The other nine pieces of paper were placed in the same box & each upon it a numbered piece as to name. The paper containing the names were then put in a box & covered over. These containing the numbers in another box and likewise covered over. The box was well sealed in order to make of the paper property one of the heirs was then placed in the one of the nine pieces of paper & another piece of paper containing the numbers into the box & only drew from said box a name and a number and then continued to draw until all were drawn, which drawing resulted thus to wit:
