resign to Its Mother dust. -

Secondly I bequeath and give to my well beloved Son Sherrod Causey one feather and
furinture - Thirdly I give and bequeath to my beloced Son Ezekiel Causey the whold of
my property to be Equally divided between the twoo after my death and all Just debts
paid - fourthly and lastly as I have twoo chanes In the land lottery and In the Event
of my being a fortunate drawer I give and bequath to my Sons Allen Causey. Ezekiel
Causey & Sherrod Causey. Also my daughter Matilda Ann Causey and her daughter Seynta
Ann Causey the whole of the lands so drawn to be Equally divided among the last mention-
ed children
