In the Name of God Amen I ~~James~~ ~~Whitehead~~ of the County of Jefferson and Province of Georgia Planter being of a perfect mind and memory and knowing that it is appointed for all men to Die I do recomend my Soul to God that give it and my Body to be laid in the Dust at the Descretion of my Exevuters and being possessed of Sundry Worldly Goods both real and personal I do leave them in the folling manner.

That is to say after the Discharge of all my Just Debts.-

Imprimis. I leave and bequeath unto my dear and loving wife Jane Whitehead all my personal Estate and the benefits arising from my real Estate except such efeats and (as is after mentioned and excepted) During her Life or Widowhood and in case she chooses to mary then the one third of all my-personall Estate.

Item I leave and bequeath unto my Eldest son John Whitehead all my real Estate that is to say my lands together with all the Improvements thereon at the Death of his Father or her Mariage also my Dun Colt two cows and calves next spring and one Rifle Gun and half of my Carpenters and Joiners Tools all my shoe makers tools and my saddle.

Item I leave and bequeath unto my second son Reason Whitehead two cows and calves the ensuing Spring and the remaining half of my Carpenters and Joiners tools one shot gun also the value of my Watchin a horse also the value of a Saddle to be taken out of the whole of my Estate left to his Mother-

Item I leave and bequeath unto my oldest Daughter Elizabeth Three cows and calves the ensuing Spring one Black Horse called 3rd and one hunting Saddle taken out of my Estate as above also one Feather Bed and furniture one Tea and Lamb.

Item I leave and Bequeath unto my third Daughter-- Catherine one Cow and Calf.

Item I leave unto my fourth Daughter Jane one Cow and Calf.

Item I leave and bequeath unto my fifth Daughter Mary one Cow and Calf.

And further I do order and ordain that if my Son John should Die without heirs of his Body begotten that then my lands do descend unto Son Reason and so of his If he should Die to his Sisters and if any of my Daughters should Die before she become of Age or Marriage that then their portions be equally divided between the Surviving Children and at the Death of my Wife Jane my Will is such that my lands be valued and the value thereof Together with all my property then in my said wife's possession be Equally divided amongst my Children so that each may have alike and a balance made at said time of the number of property Now Respectively Inherited to Each.

Lastly for the purpose of carrying into my said last Will and Testament unto Execution according to the true intent and meaning of the same I do Nominate and appoint and Do by these presents nominate and appoint My Well beloved wife Jane Whitehead, James Whitehead, and Hugh Irwin, to my----- Executors, and Executors of the said my Will and Testament and I do hereby Revoke and Disannull every Will or Will formerly made by me and discharge all such to be void and acknowledge this as my last Will and Testament in Witness whereof I set my hand and Seal on the twenty first Day of August in the year of our Lord one Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty.....
