

# Archibald Wilson's Will.

State of Georgia & In the name of God amen - I Archibald Wilson  
Johnson County of said State and County, being of advanced  
age but of sound and disposing mind and memory, knowing that I  
must shortly depart this life deem it right and proper both as respects  
my family and myself that I should make a disposition of the property  
with which a kind Providence has blessed me - I do therefore make  
this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking and annulling all  
others by me heretofore made.

Item 1) I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and  
Christian like manner suitable to my circumstances and condition in  
life my soul I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it as I hope  
for salvation through the merits and atonement of the blessed Lord and  
Savior Jesus Christ.

Item 2) Secondly, I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my Executors herein after named and appointed.

Thirdly - I give bequeath and devise to my beloved wife Mary a tract of land in Johnson County, where I now live containing three hundred acres more or less together with all my perishable property, household and kitchen furniture with the exception of seven beds and furniture to be given to Rebecca, Margaret, Henrietta, Delila, John, James, and Samuel, to have and to hold during her natural life only, and at her death, I give bequeath and devise to my sons John R., James & Samuel Wilson, a tract of land where I now live containing three hundred acres more or less on the east side of Cedar Creek in Johnson County with all the rights, members, appurtenances to the said lot of land in my wise belonging forever in fee simple, and also three head of horses. Fourthly, I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Sharpe Ten dollars. Fifthly, and the remainder of my property to be equally divided amongst my children Rebecca, Nancy, Margaret, Sarah, Henrietta, Delila, John R., James and Samuel

Sixthly, I hereby constitute and appoint my friend Bnj. DSmith and M. H. Monroe Executors of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all others heretofore made by me.

Witness my hand and Seal this Thirteenth of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & Sixty-three.
