 they witness the same for him at his request
 and in his presence and of each other and
 that we saw Benjamin Harris sign as
 a witness and that the same was executed
 voluntarily by him on the day its purports
 to have been. }

 being in a bad State of Health but of a perfect
 mind and memory thanks be given to God
 calling into mind the mortality of my body and
 knowing that it is appointed unto all men once
 to die do make and ordain this my last will
 and testament that is to say principal and
 first of all I give and bequeath recommended my
 soul in to the hands of almighty God that give
 it and my body I recommend to the earth to
 be buried in a decent Christian burial at the
 discretion of my executors and friends and to
 teaching such worldly estate as here with it
 has pleased God to bless me with in this
 life I give devise and disposed of in the
 following manner and form to wit
 First I give my hall estate to be sold
 at publick sale by such time and place

and on such terms as my executors may law-
fully determine and out of the proceeds of which I
wish all of my just debts to be paid and the
remainder I dispose of as follows to wit
first I give to my invalid negro man
Peter his maintenance during the remainder of
his life for which my executors is to make provis-
ions also I give to my sister Phineas Williams
five Dollars also the remainder of my estate I
give to be divided in five equal shares to
be paid to the families of my five brothers and
sisters to wit one share to be paid to the
children of my sister Phineas Williams of her
first husband John M. Lines to be equally divided
between said children and share to be paid to
and equally divided between the children of
my late brother Thomas Pullen one share to be
paid to my brother Moses Pullen and share
to be paid to the children of my late sister
Margaret Mason to be equally divided of said
Margaret to the executors of her husband
William L. Mason and any other of his children
and heirs and share to be paid to the children
of my late sister Mary Hicks to be equally divi-
ded between the children of said Mary to the
executors of her husband or any other of his heirs
and I do hereby make and ordain James Hicks
my sole executor to this my last Will and
Testament and I do hereby entirely disallow
revoke and disannul all and every other former
testaments Wills Legacies bequest bequeathed by
me in any will before named Will or beque-
athed satisfying and confirming this and
now other to be my last Will and Testament
in witness whereof I have hereunto set
my hand and seal this eighth day of April
A.D. one thousand eight and
thirty seven the words on the first page
to be equally divided amongst Chas. Stuckert
and expunged be four signed signed pronounced
and delivered in presence of-
