

Nathan Rawland Will

In the name of God Amen

I Nathan Rawland being of sound mind & disposing mind in consideration of the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death deem it right and proper to make my last will and testament which I do in the following manner

- Item 1^o I request that my body be decently buried in a Christian like manner
- Item 2^o I request that all my just debts be paid as soon as practicable after my death
- Item 3^o To my beloved wife I will and bequeath all this tract of land upon which I now resid containing 200 two hundred acres also one adjoining tract with all the appertinences thereto & also all my stock horses hogs cattle sheep with the exception of one cow and calf
- Item 4^o To my beloved daughter Nancy Rawland I give and bequeath one cow and one calf
- Item 5^o I do request that the tract of land upon which Mrs Mary Rawland & now resides known as the tract named he said and the proceeds be equally divided between my eldest children namely James S Rawland & wife Eliza Rawland & Rebecca Rawland Alexandra Rawland & Mary Moore Lydia Jones said tract of land is divided into two tracts one containing 444 four hundred and forty four and the other 151 one hundred and thirty seven
- Item 6^o To my daughters Ann Eliza Rawland and Margaret Rawland I will and bequeath two tracts of land one containing 400 four hundred acres and the other 200 two hundred acres lying and being on the waters of Colds Creek both tracts to be equally divided between said two children
- Item 7^o I do request that my two youngest children Lydia Ann Zona Rawland and Marthaam Rawland be raised on the land upon which I now live and at the death of my wife Sarah Rawland it be equally divided between them

- Item 8^o I do make my beloved friend Francis G. Holland Executor of this my last will and testament
- In witness whereof I ^{do} set hereunto set my hand and seal in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and Sixty and on the nineteenth day of April

son John Pyner arrives to the age of twenty
one & a year of age then all my property both
real and personal to be equally divided between
my beloved wife and my two sons

Sarah my executors of this my last will and
testament
