

Stephen Dison's Will.

Knowing the shortness of life and that all men must die I Stephen Dison of said State and County having a few worldly goods that God has blessed me with, which I wish to make disposition of which I am of a sound and disposing mind and memory I therefore make constitute and ordain this my last Will and Testament and also disannulling all others heretofore by me made or entered into whatsoever I do dispose of my estate in the following manner to wit:

- Item 1st. — I want my body buried in a Christian like manner and my soul return to God who gave it.
- Item 2nd. — I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Martha Dison one hundred acres of land lying in the fork of Robin's Creek, and a part of a two hundred acre tract I bought of Enoch Jefferson to have during her natural life or widowhood; and if she marries the land to belong to her child Jefferson, D. Dison, and I also give and bequeath to my beloved wife my black mare and one cow and yearling and all my stock hogs and plantation tools and household furniture of all description to have and to hold during her natural life or widowhood and if she marries the whole estate to be sold and the money to go to the child Jefferson. I Dison.
- Item 4th. — I give and bequeath unto my beloved son Jefferson. D. Dison one hundred acres of land on the fork of Robin's Creek, it being a part of two hundred acres; and I leave my crock for the use of my family, and I also constitute and ordain my beloved father Noah Dison my executor In witness of the said Steven Dison hath acknowledged it to be his last will and Testament signed and sealed.
