I William D. Smith of the County of Johnson
State of Georgia being in a law State of health
but of sound mind and memory thanks to
God for his mercies calling into mind the mortality
of my body and knowing that this appointment
all men once to die have thought it best to make
a disposition of the property wherewithal a kind
Providence has blessed me in this life

I therefore make this my last will and amendment
and furtherly revoking and by these presents disallowing
any former will and testament heretofore made by
me and principally and first of all I desire that
body be buried in a Christian decent and Christian
like manner in my grave herein after named

My Soul I trust will return to rest with God
who gave it ~~has~~ hope for salvation through
the merits of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ
and as touching such was my estate wherewith
it has pleased God to bless me in this life
I give devise and dispose of in the following
manner and form. etc.

First I desire that all my just debts be paid without
delay also I give and bequeath unto my three
Grand daughters Nancy Ann Elizabeth Beasley
eldest from Catharine Beasley and Ruth Jane Beasley
daughters of Redding Beasley by his first wife
They who was my daughter of tract of Land
lying in the County of Laurens on Randal
 Creek containing three hundred and eighty
Seven acres more or less, and three hundred
Dollars the above named property and money
to be placed in the possession of my two Sons
John G. Smith and Joseph C. Smith who are to
have the care and management of the same
for the benefit of my said three Grand daughters
till they shall arrive at the age of twenty
one years as untill they shall marry and in
the marriage of any or more of them as on the
at least and returning at the age of twenty one years
the above property and money with the net profits
on the same to be equally divided between the said
three Grand daughters or in case one or more of
my said Grand daughters should die before arriving
at the age of twenty one years without issue then
the survivors to inherit the whole legacy
herein bequeathed to the three

Also I give my beloved wife today the use
of the plantation and house wherein we now
live with such household Kitchen furniture
and plantation tools and also such portion of my
stock of horses cattle hogs and sheep as she may choose
to select and think she minded for her mon-
tance during her life with the right to
dispose of the same at her death to any of her
children she may think proper to give it to
etc I give and bequeath to my four children
John G. Smith Joseph C. Smith William Kimble Smith
and Elizabeth Hawland wife of Joseph Hawland
all the remainder of my estate real and personal
to be equally divided amongst them
and I hereby appointing three ones above
named John G. Smith Joseph C. Smith and
William Kimble Smith Executors to this

Foot Balances also the sum of Five Hundred Dollars
to educate her I also give her and her heirs a negro
girl named Mary and her increase & desire that if
the Lucinda H Webb should die leaving no child or
children that said negro Mary and her increase
revert to my estate and be disposed of and said amo-
unt equally divided between my Sons William John
& Eli

Item 2^c I give and desire unto my Son Giles & Webb
Five Hundred Dollars a year to be paid annually for his
support by my Executors herein after named
and I request & desire that after one or two years
trial they find Two Hundred Dollars not to
be adequate to his support that he be allowed more
as I certainly wish him kindly treated &
taken care of
