

William W. Mison's Will

State of Georgia In the name of God Amen, I William Johnson County } W Mison of said State and County being of advanced age but of sound and disposing mind and memory knowing that I must shortly depart this life deem it right and proper both as respects my family and my self that I should make a disposition of the property with which a kind providence has blessed me I do therefor make this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking and annulling all others by me heretofore made

First, I desire and direct that my Body be Buried in a decent and Christianlike manner suitable to my circumstances and conditions in life my soul I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it as I hope for salvation through the merits and atonement of the blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ

Secondly, I desire that all my just debts be paid without delay by my Executor hereinafter named and appointed

Thirdly, I give and bequeath to my Daughter Nancy Mison for her sole and separate use one Red Cow and Calf also one Bed and Bedding and Bedstead

Fourthly, I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Cordry the black Cow and her calf and one Bed

Fifthly, I give and bequeath to my son George one Red Cow with white face and her calf

Sixthly, I give and bequeath to my son James K.P. one Cow and Calf known as the black side heifer

Seventhly, I give and bequeath to my son William one Cow and Calf known as the pink Cow and her calf and yearling and one Bull two years old

Eighthly, I give and bequeath to my son Thomas one heifer yearling

Ninthly, my pigs and sheep I wish Equally divided between all of my Children and the residue of my property after my debts is paid I wish sold and the money Equally divided

Tenthly, I hereby constitute and appoint my son William Mison Executor of this my last Will and Testament. This March the 17th 1864
