Aaron Pitts Will.

In the name of God the Father & Aaron Pitts of the State of South Carolina & district of Newberry being in tolerable good health of body & of perfect sound mind & memory thank be to God for his mercies but calling to mind the mortality of this mortal life & knowing that it is appointed for all persons once to die do make & ordain this my last will & testament.

In the first place I recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God and my body of flesh to the grave to be decently buried at the direction of my executor hereafter to be named and as touching other worldly estate as god in mercy hath been pleased to bless me with I give & dispose of in the form and manner following = In the first place I give to my beloved wife Nancy Pitts one leather bed & furniture one beamean & one woman's saddle to dispose of at her will & pleasure in the second place I give to my sons Moses Pitts & Westley Pitts one horse a pease to be of the value of eighty dollars each, thereby I lend to my beloved wife during her lifetime one third part of my lands & one negro wench named Lemp. fourthly I lend to my beloved wife all the rest of my estate both real & personal of all kinds during her widowhood & she is to pay all my just debts and to raise and school my children, and when any of my children, and when any of my children married she is to pay over to them such a part of the property as she together with my exec^r shall think right & charge them with so much of their part recd and fifthly, if my wife should marry my will is that all the property lent to her during her widowhood of all kinds both real & personal be sold & the money arising to be equally divided among all my children namely, Oliver Pitts, Westley Pitts & Nancy Pitts.

so that each shall have an equal share & copy, ⁸⁰⁹⁻¹⁸³⁵ Georgia in
what each one may have received and the property above
lent during life is at her death to be sold + the money
thereby arising to be equally divided among all my children
above mentioned. I constitute + appoint my loving wife
Nancy Pitts + my son Moses Pitts to be my execr. + exec
to see to the prosecuting this my last will + testament, dis-
annulling all other wills by me made ratifying + confirming
this as my last will + testament. In witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand + fixed my seal this 17th day of January
A.D. 1817 + in the 41st year of American independence.
