I constitute & appoint my loving wife Nancy Pitts & my son Moser Pitts to be my exors. & exes to see to the prosecuting this my last will & testament, dissolving all other wills by me made ratifying & confirming this as my last will & testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & fixed my seal this 17th day of January A.D. 1817 & in the 41st year of American independence.
