In the name of God Amen, I Bathsiba Grigsby of the
 State of Georgia + County of Jones tho weak in body yet blessed
 be god, of a sound + memory do constitute this my last will
 + testament and desire it may be received by all as such,
 first I give body to the ground from whence it was taken
 with the full assurance of its resurrection at the last day,
 as to my burial I desire it may be decent, and with out
 pomp. Second I give to my beloved nephew Burrean
 Grigsby one negro woman I have named Charlotte + one
 boy Jack + one girl Sarah + all the said Charlotte increase
 hereafter. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand
 at Jones County Georgia January 1816

my daughter Sarah Kinney one negro boy named Simon, to
my daughter Mary Nunn one negro woman named Mina,
my negro man Dave is to be valued by men & sold the
money divided among all the children, the land also will be
sold & the money divided among my children and also the
stock of all kinds will be sold & the money divided among
all my children. January 2^d 1821.
