 dren and her bodily heirs. Item the 4th I give to my daugh-
 ter Barbara a certain negro woman by the name

of Venus and her child Philes. Item the 5th I give to my daughter Lucy Fimney two hundred dollars to give by the name of Alsey to her and her heirs. Item the 6th I give to my Hezekiah Fimney a part of my real estate that is to say four hundred acres of land be the same more or less wherein I now live and a negro girl by the name of Esther and a negro boy by the name of Isaac and a negro boy by the name of Harry. Item the 7th I give to my wife Ann Fimney a negro servant by the name of Hen and her child made during her life time or widow hood, then to be equally divided betwixt my son Hezekiah Fimney and my daughter Mary Ann Fimney. Item the 8th I give to my daughter Mary Ann Fimney a negro boy by the name of Lewis one bed + furniture. Item the 9th I give to my son James Fimney two hundred dollars. Item the 10th I give to my son Benjamin Fimney two hundred dollars. Item the 11th I give to my son Henry Fimney three hundred and fifty Dollars and one good bed and furniture. Item the 12th I give to my son Hezekiah Fimney the rest of my personal estate, that is to say my crop of corn and cotton waggon and gear and two head of horses a Cotton Gin the rest of the house hold and kitchen furniture my stock of hogs and Cattle. I leave my son Hezekiah Fimney to pay all my just debts and also to pay James Fimney two hundred Dollars and Benjamin Fimney two hundred dollars and Henry Fimney three hundred and fifty dollars at the expiration of two years. I leave my son Hezekiah Fimney to maintain my wife Ann Fimney during her life time or my widow and my daughter Mary Ann Fimney to be maintained by him to the age of twenty one years or marriage.
