Second Item - My will further is that all of my property both real and personal should be sold and after paying my just debts (that is, ^{or} that is not given to my wife) and the money equally divided between my children the sale to take place at the discretion of my executor to be herein after named.

Third Item - I have given some of my children some little property say a house a bed &c my will is that they all shall be made equal of the monies arising from the sale of my first property.

Fourth Item - I further ordain constitute and appoint George G. F. Mitchell and Ransom Mitchell my sons my sole Executors to carry this my will into effect.

I give to my son John Reynolds, Sanger, Lizan his wife their children Milly Rubin, Isaac and Pally, Wesley Whitman. I give to my Grand Daughter Mary C. Reynolds daughter of Robert Reynolds a negro girl Parke. I give to my Grandson Larkin L. Reynolds

Reynolds Mary a girl - I give to my Jones County Georgia Will my negro man Peter and Silva a girl also one fourth 1809-1835 of the balance of my estate to hold and to keep during her lifetime and after her death the property is to be equally divided between my three sons after John Reynolds takes the girl Silva the balance equally divided between Larkin Reynolds, Robert Reynolds, and John Reynolds - I give to Robert Reynolds one fourth part of the balance of my estate - I give to Larkin Reynolds one fourth part of the balance of my estate. I give to John Reynolds also one fourth of the balance of my estate. And appoint my sons Larkin Reynolds and John Reynolds my Executors to this my last will. whereof I do possess a sound mind and memory and have this day set my hand and affixed my seal this 21st day of September in the year of Our Lord eighteen hundred & thirty three.
