Georgia - In the name of God Amen I Caleb Oliver being, Jones County, sound in mind but weak in body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do ordain this my last will and testament. Item 1st I lend to my mother a full sufficiency of my property to maintain her during her natural life at her own option to take what and as much as she pleases.

Item 2. Any part of my perishable property as well my personal property that my mother may think proper so to direct to be sold by my Executor giving twelve months credit.

Item 3. My wife first to be paid, after the death of my mother if there should any remain, my will is first that Sally & Rebecca Pelt daughters of Henry Pelt have two hundred dollar each.

Item 4. My lands wherever I live to be equally divided giving one half to John Oliver the other half to Hardy & William Oliver all sons of John Oliver dead.

Item 5. After the death of my mother all the other remains of my property or the net proceeds thereof to be divided in the same way & between the same legatees as my land is and part of all I ordain Jesse McKen Pope & John P. Pope my executors. This 27 of October 1822.

And I do hereby appoint David Morgan and Thomas Morris as sole executors of this my last will and testament, A witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand + affixed my seal the the nineteenth day of February eighteen hundred and twenty two.
