In the name of God, Amen, I Daniel Trammell being Sick & in a low state of health, but of sound mind & memory thanks be unto God for the same, therefore calling to mind the mortality of my body & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and Ordain this my last Will & Testament in manner & form following, first I recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it, and my Body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in a decent Christian burial at the discretion of my Executors, and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I give & dispose of the same in the following manner. Inprimis I give bequeath & devise unto my dear & beloved wife Milly Trammell all my real & personal Estate during the term of her natural life, and after her decease my Will is that the same be equally divided between three Children of my beloved Brother John Trammell, named Peggy, Nancy & Daniel Trammell, to them their heirs, Exrs. & Adms. or Assigns forever And I do hereby constitute, ordain & appoint my dear & beloved wife Milly Trammell Executrix, and my beloved Brother John Trammell Executor of this my last Will and Testament. And I do hereby revoke all former Wills and Testaments by me heretofore made, declaring this & no other to be my only true last Will and Testament.

Jerre Allen's Will.

In the name of God Amen, I Jerre Allen of Baldwin
County & State of Georgia being weakly in Body, but of
perfect mind and memory do make this my last Will
and Testament in the following manner & form, that
is to say, First & principally of all I recommend my
Soul to the hands of Almighty God who gave it & my
Body I recommend to the Earth from whence it was
taken to be buried in a decent Christian manner
at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting
but I shall receive the same again by the mighty
power of God. And as touching such worldly Estate
that God hath blessed me with in my life time,
I dispose of the same in the following manner. First
I give and bequeath to my well beloved Wife Charity
Allen one Negro woman Phillis & two mares with
a Saddle & Bridle, five Cows & Calves and one Bed &
furniture. Secondly I give to my Son William Allen
One Mare Saddle & Bridle and all my Gun & Axe &
Blacksmith tools, and Thirdly all the rest of Testate
real and personally consisting of Beds, household
furniture, a negro man named George and a
negro boy named Dennis together with all the
rest of my moveable property, Books, Accounts, Notes
& Debts due & demands to be equally divided
