I Dugal McFarland of the aforesaid state & county of Jones County being weak of body though of perfect mind & memory knowing that it is appointed for all men to die do make & ordain this my last will & Testament in manner & form following (that is to say) First I recommend my soul to God who gave it & my body I recommend to the Earth from whence it came to be buried at a Christian burial at the discretion of my Executors, and as to such worldly wealth as it has pleased God to bestow on me I give bequeath & dispose of the same as follows

First I give & bequeath to my beloved spouse Catharine McFarland during her widowhood the lot of land I now live on & six negroes (to wit) Nancy, Joe, Amy, Sam, Lingo & Jack. With all the increase of said Amy like-wise all my stock of horses cattle Hogs & sheep, my household & kitchen furniture Beds & furniture plantation and farm utensils of every description. I should my wife & myself after my decease I wish one of my Executors to take

convenient to hand her a five dollar bill & give her valuable money as her part of my estate & be & every^{thing} that I have left her above except the five dollars to be Equally divided between my four sons to wit William McFarland James Duncan McFarland Nancy McFarland & Robert Thomas McFarland only with the exception at the time of the division of the within property that I wish my youngest son Robert Thomas to have one Hundred dollars worth of the property more than any of his brothers & said property not to be divided until said Robert Thomas comes to the age of twenty one years and a certain lot of land drawn by me in the county of Dooly the thirteenth District to be also equally divided among the above mentioned sons to wit Wm McFarland James D. McFarland McRay McFarland & Robert T. McFarland as soon as my son Wm. McFarland can sell said lot of land in Dooly County —

Secondly I give and bequeath to my son John McFarland Twenty dollars —

Thirdly I give & bequeath unto my son Andrew McFarland Five dollars —

Fourthly I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Little McFarland Twenty five dollars —

Fifthly I give and bequeath unto Samuel W. Patterson who was married to my daughter Catharine McFarland one Spanish milled dollar for his part of my Estate —

Sixthly I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Janet Kilchrist McFarland children Twenty five dollars when it can be conveniently spared out of the profits of my plantation —

Seventhly I give & bequeath unto my daughter Nancy Mullins McFarland Twenty five dollars to be paid when it can be conveniently spared from the production of my plantation —

Eighthly I give & bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Ross McFarland Twenty five dollars to be paid to her as soon as it can be made without selling property to make the same —

Ninthly and lastly I appoint Wm Clarke Abraham Card & Wm McFarland my true & lawful Executors to pay all my lawful debts and to settle with all the Legates as soon as convenient without selling any part of the property except what will pay my debts and funeral expenses —

This my last will & Testament to be considered in law Equal and that this will be in law signed

Negro Man named Tom & one thousand dollars in money
all Ready received
