Ebenezer H. Moore's Will.

Georgia } In the name of God Amen - I Ebenezer H. Moore
 Jones County } being of sound mind but in bad health and know-
 ing that it is allotted for all men once to die, do constitute this
 instrument as my last will as follows.

1st I wish my body to be decently buried agreeable to the wishes
 of my family. 2nd I wish all my just debts paid out of my prop-
 erty in manner as follows by the sale of the growing crop of cotton
 and so much of the corn fodder &c as can be spared over a sup-
 port for my wife and family. Then I wish so much of all my
 stock sold of Horses cattle Hogs + goats as to discharge my
 debts and if it shall be required to sell more property to dis-
 charge the debts, then I wish the negro man Harry sold and
 the debts due me or so much as can be col-
 lected to be paid to my debts before the sale of the negro
 I wish my loving wife Mary Moore to have the

negro girl Louiza and her increase (if any) during the life of my wife and I wish my wife to have all my House furniture, Beds, furniture +stead Cooking utensils &c during her life or untill one of my children shall marry, when my wife shall give a bed furniture +stead to the child just married and so to every child after as they shall marry a bed furniture and stead and that also I give to my wife the land whereon I now live during her life and the land that I purchased of Philip Brooks to remain attached to the Land I now live on or to be sold as my Executors may think most advisable to do for the benefit of my Estate - 4th I wish at the death of my wife the land above named and not sold to be equally divided between my two sons Womly + Christopher with all the farming tools &c there on the place. 5th I wish after the death of my wife the negro Louiza and her increase (if any) all sold and the proceeds of the sale to be equally divided between all my Daughters or their Heirs. 6th Should my Executors find or think it not necessary to sell the negro Harry for the discharge of my debts, then I wish my Executors to sell him Harry on a credit and when the proceeds of his sale is collected to purchase a young negro with the money. 7th I wish this young negro if so purchased as above requested to be worked or hired out as my Executors may think most advisable and the proceeds to be applied to the schooling of my three youngest children Womly, Christopher and Martha Ann and at the expiration of ten years from the time I wish this negro or proceeds of said negro to be equally divided my three above named children, Womly, Christopher and Martha Ann. 8th I nominate and appoint my loving wife Mary Moore and my Son Greenbury Moore as my Executors and Executors to this my last will and Testament, given under my hand and Seal this 6th day of June 1831.

I Lewis Wimberly of the State and County aforesaid being of sound mind and memory make & ordain this my last will and testament (to wit) I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Childers one Negro Woman named Agan one negro man named Joe that George Childers the husband of the said Elizabeth have traded by my consent, and a boy named Sonny a boy named Charles a girl named Pleasant and a girl named Patience with the increase of said negroes. I give and bequeath to the heirs of Titus Wimberly Deceased (to wit) Lewis I. Wimberly Samuel Thomas Wimberly and Melly E. Wimberly all that part of that lot of Land No Eighteen in the Eighth District of Originally Baldwin now Jones County which was not assigned off at the dower of Martha Wimberly the widow of the said Titus deceased and after the death of my wife Melly Wimberly. I give and bequeath to the heirs aforesaid the dower in said Lot Eighteen also two negro boys named Peter and Alfred and a girl named Hester with the increase of said negroes. I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Eliza N. Pindon a negro woman named Hasty a man named Anthony and a boy named Ned with the increase of said negroes. I give and bequeath to my daughter Sally Thine a negro woman named Dinah a girl named Margot a boy named Charles a boy named Joe a boy named Bob and a girl named Jude with the increase of said negroes. I leave to my wife Melly Wimberly during her natural life all that lot of Land wherein I now live with the appurtenances thereunto belonging known as No Seventeen in the eighth district of Jones County. Also Martha Wimberly dower in Lot Eighteen in the eighth district. Also a negro man named Jeff a man named Sam and a woman named Fannie and a woman named Sucky.
