January 17th day 1818

I Elijah Martin being in my proper senses and a citizen of
Jones County Ga. do hereby bequeath to my loving daughter
Sarah Coulter twenty five cents also my loving daughter
Nancy have twenty five cents, also my loving daughter
Rachel wit twenty five cents. it is my will that my son
Martin may be in full possession of all the rest of my estate
both real and personal during his widowhood. I do appoint
my son Sam Martin as my executor in the fear of God to
act & transact for me agreeable to my above stated will it
further my will that said Sam Martin Coulter may have half
as much one of the rest that are not above named in the
will, it further my will that all the rest of mine may
have equal, this acknowledges to be my last will and test-
ament
