Elizabeth Brays Will.

In the name of God Amen I Elizabeth Bray being weak of
body but of sound mind do make this my last will and
testament - Viz.

1st I recommend my Soul to God who gave it and my body
to be buried in a Christian like manner

2nd It is my will and desire that all my just debts be
paid -

3rd I give and bequeath unto my daughter Abby Saunders
wife of John Saunders one negro woman named Mariah
to her own use and her heirs forever.

4th I give and bequeath unto my daughter ^{Elizabeth} wife of Hiskiah H. Lipsey one negro boy named Dick and one negro woman named Mary now with child also one mare three head of cattle one bed and furniture and one side board to her and her heirs forever for their own use.

5th I give and bequeath to my son Thomas Bray one negro woman named Jude and one negro boy named Mathew also one Bed Bedstead and furniture one mahogany table one trunk and forty three dollar note on William Bray to him and his heirs forever and whereas William Bray in his life time did give me his note and mortgage to secure me in the sum of four hundred dollars on a negro boy named Antony dated 20th of May 1823. which said mortgage was foreclosed on 1st March 1824 and execution issued thereon.

Now I give and bequeath to my said son Thomas all my right title + interest to the said note mortgage on execution for + against the said negro boy named Antony to him and his heirs forever.

6th Whereas William Bray in his life time left with me one horse and gig to sell and as now but the horse is sold now it is my will and desire that the note for which the horse was sold which amounts to eighty dollars and twelve + 1/2 cents and the gig be returned to Hephzibeth Bray the same being part of W^m Brays estate.

And I do hereby constitute and appoint Thomas Bray my son and my son in law Hiskiah H. Lipsey to be my lawful Executors to this my last will and testament hereby revoking all others. In witness whereof I have hereto set my hand and seal this 13th Oct- 1825.

this my last will and testament in manner and form
as follow — I resign my soul into the hands of Almighty
God hoping in a happy resurrection. the merits and atone-
ment of his son Jesus Christ. And my worldly estate with
which the Lord has been pleased to bless me I give and de-
vise as follows —

- 1st To my beloved son George Cuthers I give and bequeath
one tract of land already received at four hundred dollars
forever.
- 2nd To my beloved son Thomas Cuthers I give and bequeath
one negro boy named Leah already received at four hun-
dred dollars forever —
- 3rd I give and bequeath unto my beloved son Andrew
Cuthers one negro boy by the name of Ben already re-
ceived at four hundred dollars forever —
- 4th To my beloved daughter Polly Jane Cuthers I give and
bequeath two negro girls Betty and Ciny at four hundred
not yet Rec^d also one bay mare one saddle and bridle
one feather bedstead and furniture one Red cow. and her
milk the same being six in number now and should
the said Jane die leaving no issue the whole of my bequests
to her shall be equally divided between my surviving heirs —
- 5th To my beloved daughter Nancy Whitesides I give and be-
queath two negro girls already Rec^d at eight hundred dollars
to have and use during her natural life and at her death to be
equally divided between the heirs of her body —
