John, to my daughter Jane one negro boy named Anthony &
one bed and furniture & one trunk, to my daughter Abby one
negro girl named Linda & one bed & furniture & one trunk, to
my daughter Sarah Kinney one negro boy named Simon, to
my daughter Mary Munn one negro woman named Mina,
my negro man Dave is to be valued by men & sold the
money divided among all the children, the land also will be
sold & the money divided among my children and also the
stock of all kinds will be sold & the money divided among
all my children. January 2^d 1821.
