my last Will and Testament -

2^d I appoint Noah Butt my whole and sole Executor to act and
to do on my estate.

3rd I give my daughter Mary Wall one feather bed and furniture
and one trunk

4th I give my son James Wall one small trunk and one bed
apart

5th I give my daughter Elizabeth Wall one feather bed and fu-
rniture and one trunk & I give my son David Wall one bed
and furniture. It is my will that all the balance of my prop-
erty be sold and equally divided amongst them all after giv-
ing my son David one year Schooling, as they become of
age, and if either should die before they come of age I want my
son James to have their bed and furniture should either marry
before they come of age I wish them then to have their part of prop-
erty this 8th April 1824

mind & memory have thought proper this 15th day of October
in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty
three to make and ordain this my last will and testament.
1st I wish all my just debts paid as soon as my present crop
is sold.

2nd I give to my Son Christopher Wyche one negro boy named
Sam.

3rd I give to my Son Alfred Wyche one negro boy named Anthony
one good horse one good feather bed and furniture and one
decent suit of clothes to be paid for out of the present crop.

4th I give to my Son Albert Wyche one negro boy named George
one good horse saddle and bridle and one good feather bed
and furniture and one decent suit of clothes to be paid for
out of the present crop.

5th I give to my Son John R. Wyche one negro boy named
Luke one good horse saddle and bridle and one good feather
bed and furniture.

6th I give to my Daughter Frances Wyche one negro girl
named Lenoir one good feather bed and furniture.

7th I give to my Son Peter McDonough Wyche one negro
girl named Harriet and one negro boy named Austin.

8th I leave one tract of Land in Jasper County together with
three negroes namely Daniel, Virgin & Oliver. In case the
same shall now pending in the Superior Court for the com-
ty against Henry Wyche principal and my self security for
J. D. Weatherby & Co. If said suit should go against me

the above property to be sold on a credit so as to meet
payment of said debt and should said debt not be
