2<sup>nd</sup> Item I give to my two brothers Womely B. Moore and Christopher C. Moore my square of land adjoining the land wherein my mother now lives to be equally divided between them after the death of my mother.

3<sup>rd</sup> Item I wish my mother and her family to have my horses cattle and hogs and all other property that I may now have.

4<sup>th</sup> Item - I wish my land not divided but to be cultivated for the benefit and support of the family during my mother's life or as long as she may live on the land she now does for her family -

5<sup>th</sup> Item I do nominate and appoint my mother as executrix and

my brother Wmly L. Moore as Executor This my will this 3<sup>rd</sup>  
of February 1834.

Georgia In the name of God Amen. I, Jesse Cox Sen<sup>r</sup>  
Jones County of said state and county being weak in body,  
but of sound mind and disposing memory do make this my last  
will and testament in manner and form following to wit  
Item 1 give and bequeath to my beloved wife Nancy Cox  
One negro man Daniel, one Negro Woman Zilpha with her  
future increase one negro boy Ambrose about twelve years of  
age, one bed and furniture, to her and her heirs forever.  
Item 2 Also one lot or tract of land containing two hundred  
and two and half acres more or less situated, being and  
lying in the sixth district of originally Baldwin now Jones  
County being distinguished in the plan of said District by  
number one hundred and fifty five, No 155 and granted to  
Thomas Haywell, to have and to hold the said tract of land  
with all and singular the rights members and appurtenances  
thereto belonging unto her the said Nancy Cox during her  
natural life, and at her death to revert to her four children  
namely Ira, Nancy, Leander and Franklin & to them and  
their assigns forever.

Item 3 I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Nancy  
Cox for her own proper use and benefit my slave
