2nd Item I give to my two brothers Wmly B. Moore and Christopher C. Moore my square of Land adjoining the Land whereon my mother now lives to be equally divided between them after the death of my mother.

3rd Item I wish my mother and her family to have my Horses cattle and Hogs and all other property that I may now have.

4th Item — I wish my land not divided but to be cultivated for the benefit and support of the family during my mother's life or so long as she may live on the Land she now does occupy a family.

I sign and appear my mother or executor and

my brother Wmly B. Moore as Executor This will be the 3rd
of February 1834

but of sound mind and disposing memory do make this my last
will and testament in manner and form following (to wit)
1st Item I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Nancy Cox
One negro man Daniel, one Negro Woman Zilpha with her
future increase one negro boy Ambrose about twelve years of
age, one bed and furniture, to her and her heirs forever.
Item 2 - Also one lot or tract of land containing two hund-
red two and half acres more or less situated, being and
lying in the sixth district of originally Baldwin now Jones
County being distinguished in the plan of said District by
number one hundred and fifty five, No 155 and granted to
Thomas Hazwell, to have and to hold the said tract of Land
with all and singular the rights members and appurtenances
thereunto belonging unto her the said Nancy Cox during her
natural life, and at her death to revert to her four children
namely Ira, Nancy, Leander and Franklin & to them and
their assigns forever

Item 3rd I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Nancy
Cox for her own proper use and benefit my personal
