Coloured mare and all my stock of cattle and hogs except the cow
and calf which I have before given to my daughter Elizabeth
Cooper and the cow and heifer which I have given to my grand-
son David Cooper and all the farming utensils with all the house-
hold and kitchen furniture and the present crop of corn fodder & dur-
ing her natural life and to be at her disposal and after her death
I wish all this Chattel property or so much as may remain in
hand to be equally divided between my two sons Funeral Owen
and Spencer Owen except such property as has already
been named and given to others before mentioned.

11th I do nominate and appoint my loving wife Mary Owen and
my son Funeral Owen as my Executrix of this my last will and
testament and I do wish those said Executrix to pay and dis-
charge as soon as may be in their power out of the before men-
tioned property or other wise all the lawful debts which I
may be owing in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and seal this 21st day of September A.D. 1822

Item 3rd I give to my Daughter Mary Sexton twenty Dollars
Item 4th I give to my daughter Sarah C Brooks five Dollars
Item 5th I give to my daughter Rebecca Meadows five Dollars
Item 6th I give to my son Samuel Thompson five Dollars
Item 7th I give to my son James Thompson one negro boy named
Alford
Item 8th I give to my son John Thompson one negro boy named
Allen - Item 9th I give to my son Marshal Thompson one neg-
ro girl named Polly and five hundred Dollars to him and his
heirs forever
Item 10th I give to my daughter Sabathia Thompson one Neg-
ro girl named Priscilla and one thousand Dollars to her
and her heirs forever all the rest of my property both real
and personal I give to my son James Thompson my son John
Thompson my son Marshal Thompson and my daughter
Sabathia Thompson to be sold at the discretion of my Executors
or otherwise and equally divided between them, to them and
their heirs forever - Lastly reposing special confidence in
my friends William Williams and William Harris I do con-
stitute and appoint them Executors to this my last Will and
testament - In Witness whereof I hereunto set my hand
and seal this 22nd day of February in the year of our Lord
one thousand eight hundred and twenty three -

John C Smith's Will

Georgia } In the name of God Amen
Jones County I d John C. Smith knowing that it is appointed once
for all men to die and being weak in body but of sound memory
and disposing mind do make and constitute this my last will
and testament in the words following to wit -

1st I will and bequeath my soul into the hands and care
of God who gave it and my body to a Christian like burial -
2nd That all my just and lawful debts be paid. 3rd That
my Executors herein after appointed proceed to sell the land where
on I now live immediately after the present crop should be
gathered or as soon thereafter as they should think an advant-
ageous sale could be made and in what manner that
they should think to be of the most advantage to my estate
and the money arising from such sale together with what
money may be collected on note and bond and such part
the crop as may be sold or so much thereof as my Execu-
tors may think proper to be laid out in purchasing of an
other settlement of land which said settlement of land
when so purchased I will and bequeath to my loving
wife Elizabeth Smith during her life and if at any time
my wife Elizabeth Smith should marry the said settlement
of land is not to be subject to any debt or debts of her hus-
band so as her life estate in said settlement of land
should be sold there for and after her death to be equally
divided between my children.

4th I will and bequeath my big and harness to my loving
wife Elizabeth Smith.

5th I will and bequeath to my loving wife Elizabeth Smith
all my household and kitchen furniture including beds and
their furniture also all my horses that I have at the pres-
ent and such other horse or horses that should be bought by
my Executors during the present year to assist in tending the
present crop Also all my cows hogs and stock of every kind
together with the implements and working tools during her
widowhood

6th I will and bequeath to my loving wife Elizabeth Smith
