Georgia } I Jacob Dennis Senr. of the state and County  
Jones County aforesaid being in good sound and disposing  
mind and memory and being desirous to settle my  
worldly affairs whilst I have strength and capacity so to  
do, making and ordaining and publish this my last will  
testament hereby revoking and making void all former  
wills by me at any time hereafter made. And first  
and principally I commit my soul unto the hands  
of my Creator who gave it and my body to the earth to be  
interred in a decent Christian like manner at the dis-  
cretion of my executor here in after named and as to  
such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to  
entrust me, I dispose of the same as followeth.

Item 1<sup>st</sup> I will and desire that all my just debts funeral  
and other expenses of my last illness be paid as  
soon after my decease as conveniently can be.

Item 2<sup>d</sup> I will and bequeath unto my son John Dennis  
five negroes viz Aaron Saml L. Dave, Bill and John.

Item 3<sup>d</sup> I will and bequeath unto my son William  
Dennis five negroes viz Lewis B. Lane Alexander  
William & George.

Item 4 I will and bequeath unto my  
son John Dennis five negroes viz Tom Jim Stephen

I shaw and Milley— 5th I will and bequeath unto my daughter Rachel Armstrong eight hundred dollars to be paid out of the first money which ~~from~~ my land or stock.

I tem 6 I will that Phillis Peter and Delph my plantation and all my land stock of all kind with my household furniture plantation utensils be sold to the highest bidder at twelve months credit taking small notes with approved security and when collected and eight hundred dollars due to Rachel Armstrong then the balance to be equally divided between John Dennis William Dennis and Peter Dennis. I tem 7 and lastly I nominate John Dennis William Dennis Peter Dennis and James Jones Esq. Executors of my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 30<sup>th</sup> October 1816.
