First of all it is my last will + desire that all my estate both real + personal should vest + remain in the hands of my beloved wife Eleanor Blacklock by her freely to be enjoyed during her natural life or widowhood but at her death or marriage I will + bequeath all my ^{property} to James Grice known by the name of James Blacklock Junr. whom I raised from a child viz. Robert a negro man + Polly his wife with all her children named as follows Marshal, Sam, Elijah, Bob + Buck boys - Nancy + her three children Mary, Sant + Henry Eliza + her two children, Green + John, Henry, Lucinda, Ellen + Martha also Sam my Blacksmith, George Rice + Buck Senr. also Willy + her wife, Patty together with Aggy + her child named Petina. I also will + bequeath to the same James Grice known only by the name of James Blacklock Junr. one lot & a half of land in Jones County on which I now live, also one lot of land which own in Apison County together with all my other Estate + I do hereby nominate + appoint the said James Grice alias James Blacklock Junr my only + sole executor of this my last will + testament + I do hereby countermand, revoke + disannul all my former wills + testaments, ratifying + confirming this only to be my last will + testament - The Day + date above written.
