4th In the event of any one of the legates dying before they receive their appointed legacy, then said legacies to be equally divided between the surviving legates.

5th And lastly I nominate and appoint my dear wife Charlotte Harrison and my sons George and William Harrison my executrix and my executor to this my last will and testament.

In the name of God amen I James Paramore of the State of Georgia and County of Telfair being in a low State of health but of reasonable mind and understanding and calling into mind the mortality of all mankind and knowing that it is appointed for them that to die I do therefore make and ordain this to be my last will and testament. first I will and bequeath my soul into the Almighty God that first gave it me. Secondly I will and bequeath that my body be buried in a Christian like manner as touching such worldly Estate as it hath been pleased God to bless me with in this life I do hereby bequeath it in the following manner - first I bequeath that all my just debts be first paid -

Secondly I will and bequeath unto my beloved wife Sarah Parramore during her natural life all my ~~estate~~ ^{both} real and personal household and kitchen furniture except such as are hereafter disposed of under the following directions that is to say unto each of my children that doth now live with me that is to say Lidy Marian, Jane Roxanna = Mathew Everett + Dorcy Parramore the sum of four hundred and ten dollars each to be paid under the following directions that is to say to Lidy four hundred and ten dollars to be paid unto her two years after date hereof and the sum of four hundred and ten dollars to Marian three years after the date hereof and unto Jane Roxanna, Mathew, Everett and Dorcy Parramore, to each of them the sum of four hundred and ten dollars as above when they shall arrive at the age of twenty one years of age and at the death of my beloved wife Sarah Parramore all the remaining part of my estate that doth remain in her hands or possession at her death or in the hands of any other person then the same ^{and} to be equally divided between my heirs except the children of my daughter Betty Liker that is to say Tereson James F. John B. and Betty L. Liker and to each of them I will and bequeath the sum of one dollar each as there full share of my estate and should any of the negroes ever be got or the value thereof that I did low of her credit for them they or the amount of the money or other property that shall be so received shall be equally divided amongst my children or there heirs except the children of my daughter Betty Liker whose father has had there part of my estate except the above sum that I have left them in this will thirdly I will and bequeath that all my lands laying in the county of Telfair to be sold at the discretion of my executors for the benefit of my heirs and creditors, fourthly I do constitute and ordain this to be my last will and testament hereby disannulling all former will or wills heretofore made by me and I do hereby appoint my beloved wife Sarah Parramore and Joshua McClane my executors of this my last will and testament, January 15th 1823.

same time ^{maintain} clothe + educate my two youngest Sons
Saml. + George + keep them at school or studying some pro-
fession untill they are of age, and any profits arising
above the maintainance is here provided at the same time
there shall not be more than two acres of land cleared on the
place pr year - nor no more timber cut on the land then
shall keep up out side fences my will further is that my fam-
ily keep as much together as possible and that my carriage
+ house be kept for the use of my family as it advantages to
the family as long as considered as by my Executors + my
will is further that my farm here be from one third to
half sowed in small grain every year and that my wife
have two mules Janney + Pompey for the good of the
farm and all the necessary stock on the place for
