Harrison and my sons George and William Harrison my execu-  
tor and my executor to this my last will and testament.

of Georgia and County of Telfair being in a low state of health  
but of reasonable mind and understanding and calling  
into mind the mortality of all mankind and knowing that  
it is appointed for them all to die I do therefore make and or-  
dain this to be my last will and testament first I will and  
bequeath my soul unto the Almighty God that first gave it me  
secondly I will and bequeath that my body be buried in a  
Christian like manner as touching such worldly Estate  
which hath been pleased God to bless me with in this life  
I will bequeath it in the following manner first  
I will bequeath that all my just debts be first paid

Secondly I will and bequeath unto my beloved wife Sarah Parramore during her natural life all my estate both real and personal household and kitchen furniture except such as are here after disposed of under the following directions that is to say unto each of my children that doth now live with me that is to say Siddy Marian, James Roxanna = Matthew Everett + Dorry Parramore the sum of four hundred and ten dollars each to be paid under the following directions that is to say to Siddy four hundred and ten dollars to be paid unto her two years after date hereof and the sum of four hundred and ten dollars to Marian three years after the date hereof and unto James Roxanna, Matthew Everett and Dorry Parramore, to each of them the sum of four hundred and ten dollars as above when they shall arrive at the age of twenty one years of age and at the death of my beloved wife Sarah Parramore all the remaining part of my estate that doth remain in her hands or possession at her death or in the hands of any other person then the same <sup>are</sup> to be equally divided between my heirs except the children of my daughter Betty Sikes that is to say Tereson James T. John & and Betty S. Sikes and to each of them I will and bequeath the sum of one dollar each as their full share of my estate and should any of the negroes ever be got or the value thereof that I did low <sup>for</sup> them for them they or the amount of the money or other property that shall be so received shall be equally divided among my children or there heirs except the children of my daughter Betty Sikes whose father has had there part of my estate except the above sum that I have left them in this will thirdly I will and bequeath that all my lands laying in the County of Telfair to be sold at the discretion of my executors for the benefit of my heirs and creditors, forthly I do constitute and ordain this to be my last will and testament hereby disannulling all former will or wills heretofore made by me and I do hereby appoint my beloved wife Sarah Parramore and Joshua McCasne my executors of this my last will and testament, January 15<sup>th</sup>, 1823.

In the name of God amen I Samuel Cook of the County of Jones  
+ State of Georgia do make this my last will & testament in  
manner & form witnesseth I give my body to the dust from  
whence it came & my soul to God who gave it my will is  
after my death my wife Sarah & Cook shall have two neg-  
roes Anna & Ben during her life and at her death to go to  
my youngest Son George Wm Cook & that my wife continue to  
live where she now doth and have charge of the place & neg-  
roes belonging to the two youngest Sons Saml J. Cook George  
W. Cook which Negroe & will hereafter name and she  
shall have all the profits arising from said land and Negroes  
during her natural life or widowhood and at her death or mar-  
riage she mother futer heirs shall have no claim to any thing of  
mine whatever provided that my wife Sarah shall at the  
same time <sup>maintain</sup> clothe & educate my two youngest Sons  
Saml & George & keep them at school or studying some pro-  
fession until they are of age, and any profits arising  
above the maintenance is here provided at the same time  
there shall not be more than two acres of land cleared on the  
place per year - nor no more timber cut on the land then  
will keep up out side fence my will further is that my fam-  
ily keep as much together as possible and that my carriage  
& house be kept for the use of my family as it advantages to  
the family as long as considered so by my Executrix & my  
will is further that my farm here be from one third to  
one half in small grain every year and that my wife  
have two oxen Jeremy & Pompey for the work of the  
farm and all the necessary stock on the place for
