James Williams Will

In the name of God the Father & James Williams of Jones
County and State of Georgia being of sound + perfect mind +
memory, blessed be God — do this first day of June in the
year of our Lord 1819 make + publish this my last will
and testament in manner following that is to say first
I give + bequeath to my daughter Martha Moore one negro
girl by the name of Rose, now in her possession, one feather
bed + furniture + what I have heretofore given her to her and
her heirs forever. — — —

I term 1st I give + bequeath to my daughter Eliza D. McDowell
one negro boy by the name of Edmund one feather bed + fu-
iture and what I have heretofore given her to her + her heirs
forever. I also leave unto my aforesaid daughter Eliza

negro woman named Michel until I or her mother calls for her and no longer.

Item 2. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Rebecca M. Bunkley one negro girl named Mariah one feather bed + furniture, one horse + saddle now in her possession + what I have heretofore given her, her + her heirs forever.

Item 3. I give + bequeath to my daughter Mary W. Williams one negro girl by the name of Susan one feather bed + furniture, one horse + saddle to her + her heirs forever.

Item 4. I give + bequeath to my son Howell G. Lovell Williams one negro woman + child by the names of Olive + Ben one feather bed + furniture, one horse and saddle one gun to him + his heirs forever.

Item 5. I give + bequeath to my son William D. Williams one negro boy by the name of Harry one feather bed + furniture, one horse + saddle + one gun to him + his heirs forever.

And it is my wish + desire that the above named negroes Olive + Ben + Harry which said negroes I wish to continue with my wife Sally Williams until Howell G. Williams + Wm D. Williams respectively come of age. And also my will + desire is that my said son Wm have his choice of a young negro of the increase of the remaining stock.

I leave to my beloved wife Sally Williams all my lands + all the rest + residue of my property after paying all my just debts during her life or widowhood - provided she should marry my will + desire is she should have a childe part of the perishable property + at her death to be equally divided between my four daughters, Martha Moore, Olive McDowell, Mary W. Williams + Rebecca M. Bunkley except my two daughters Mary W. Williams + Rebecca Bunkley my will + desire is that they should have one hundred + fifty dollars each in consequence of their negroes being inferior in value; but in case Rebecca M. Bunkley should die without issue, my will is that her part in the last division return to + be equally divided between her three sisters, Martha Moore, Olive McDowell + Mary Williams at the expiration of the life or widowhood of my wife Sally Williams my will + desire is that my lands be divided between my two sons Howell G. Williams + Wm D. Williams the unimproved part to Howell G. Williams + the other half square to my son Wm D. Williams.

And I do hereby make & ordain my wife Sally Williams Executrix & my son in law Thomas C. M. Dowell Executor of this my last will & testament. In witness whereof I the said James Williams have to this my last will & testament set my hand & seal the day & year above written.

Mary Philips Will.

In the name of God amen I Mary Philips widow of so-
men Philips late of Jones County Georgia deceased, calling to
mind that mortality must put on immortality and that
it is appointed for all mortals once to die & being of sound
mind & disposing memory do make & ordain this my last
will & testament as follows (to wit) first of all after my
decease that my body be decently interred, and my burial
expenses be speedily paid, and that my just debts be as
speedily paid as circumstances will admit. — Secondly
to my sons Joseph Cowen & Wm A. Cowen & my daughter
Mary Cowen, I will that all my estate both real & per-
sonal, that I may be in possession of at the time of my
decease as may be entitled to, be equally divided amongst
them. And lastly I nominate & appoint my two sons Joseph
Cowen & Wm A Cowen my executors to this my last will &
testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
& seal this 9th day of November in the year of our Lord one
thousand eight hundred & eighteen.
