Adkerson. Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my friends Robert Gilliam and George Stovall Executors of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all others or former testaments by me here tofore made. In witness where of I have here unto set my hand and affixed my seal this thirteenth day of December 1803 signed sealed published and declared as and for the last will and testament of the above named John Adkerson in presence of us

 death or marriage to return to my son George L. Taylor.

 I give and bequeath one bed and furniture. 6th My will + de-
 sire is that my wife Sally Taylor keep all my property in
 her own hands without interruption during her widow-
 hood and at her death or marriage my will is that the
 whole of my property be equally divided among my six
 children (viz) Nancy Polly Lacey Henny Lassiter Sally Perdue
 Rachel Thomas + George L. Taylor this I do of my own free
 will Revoking all other wills by me made signed sealed in
